## **Definition of CPD**

Continuing Professional Development (CPD) is ongoing. It enables the individual, in collaboration with their organisation, to maintain, develop and gain recognition for existing and new professional skills, knowledge and competence.

## The principles of CPD

### Continuing Professional Development:

- is a collective responsibility, with the individual, forces and the College of Policing working together to support the individual's development
- 2 balances the needs and aspirations of the individual with the requirements of the organisation and the service as a whole

- supports the individual to remain professionally competent in their role through a continuing process that recognises and builds upon existing competence
- is recorded to show the effect that it is having on the individual's professional practice
- 5 benefits the public by helping to ensure that policing provides a high quality of service
