#### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 This product licence schedule forms part of the College of Policing's (the 'Licensor's') consolidated licence. # 2. Background

2.1 RISDP is an interim programme, developed in response to the findings of Operation Soteria Bluestone, it provides the minimum level of training to existing or new rape and serious sex offences (RASSO) investigators, who have not received specialist training to ensure that can deliver an acceptable level of service to victims of these very serious crimes. The standard RASSO investigator pathway, PIP2 and Specialist Sexual Assault Investigators Development Programme (SSAIDP), provides a higher level of specialist training and forces should continue to use PIP2 and SSAIDP as a pathway to the specialism for those cohorts who do not fit the target audiences. Investigators who have received current SSAIDP training might be supported with this programme as CPD.

2.2 This programme has been developed to respond to the findings from Operation Soteria Bluestone researchers examining the policing response to RASSO. Many investigators they spoke to had little or no specialist training in RASSO. This programme aims to support the rapid upskilling of investigators as part of the project.

# 3. Licensed Purpose

- 3.1 Subject to the licence terms, this Licence enables the Licensee to deliver the Product to the Permitted Audience.

# 5. Applying for a Licence and access to Licensed Resources

classified as OFFICIAL-SENSITIVE or above under the GSC or contain police tactics and must use all reasonable endeavours to secure exemptions from disclosure.

#### 9. Licence Term

9.1 The licence term for this Product ends on 31 March 2024.

#### 10. Licence Fees

- 10.1 There is no licence fee for Home Office Police Forces to use this Product.
- 10.2 An annual licence fee of £564 applies from 1 April 2023 to 31 March 2024, to Licensees who are not Home Office Police Forces.
- 10.3 The Licensor reserves the right to impose charges in relation to the Train-the-Trainer events on a cost recovery basis.
- 10.4 Any support required by the Licensee to use/deliver this Product will be charged at a daily rate to be agreed by both parties.

#### 12. Use of Licensor's Logo and Copyright Assertion Notice

12.1 Removal of the Licensor's logo or any copyright protection from the licensed materials is prohibited.

#### 13. Permitted Audience

- 13.1 Where the Licensee is a Home Office Police Force, the Product may be used to provide training to its Internal Staff and also to other Home Office Police Forces personnel.
- 13.2 Where the Licensee is not a Home Office Police Force, the Product shall only be used to provide training to its Internal Staff on a non-commercial basis, except as expressly authorised under the Licence.

- 20.2 Where the Licensee is not a Home Office Police Force, this Product shall only be used within the Licensee's Official Business Premises.

#### 21. Trainer Standards

- 21.1 Licensees delivering this Product shall ensure all their trainers meet the Police Sector Standards for Training of Trainers, as appropriate. The standards can be found on the Licensor's <u>Training Essentials Programme (TEP) webpage</u>, under the 'Additional documents' title in the Key Details table.
- 21.2 Licensee's nominated trainers delivering the trainer-led RISDP modules shall meet the following criteria:
  - The Police Sector Standards for the Training of Trainers (as per clause 21.1).
  - Have completed all 8 of the RISDP online modules.
  - Have attended or watched on Knowledge Hub Dr Patrick Tidmarsh's masterclasses developed as part of Operation Soteria Bluestone.
  - Have a basic understanding of the 'Whole Story' approach to RASSO.
  - Have successfully completed the College's RISDP Train-the-Trainer programme.
- 21.3 All trainers are responsible for maintaining their occupational knowledge of subjects within RISDP via continuing professional development (CPD), in line with national and organisational requirements.

#### 22. Police Service Quality Management System (PSQMS)

- 22.1 The PSQMS is the Licensor's online software application used to manage quality assurance in line with the national policing curriculum. Where the Licensee is required to undertake a self-assessment to demonstrate to the Licensor that it meets the required standards set by the Licensor, the Licensor hereby grants the Licensee a licence to access and use the PSQMS solely for this purpose.

- 23.4 Where the Licensee is not a Home Office Police Force, the Licensee may either monitor their use or delivery of the Product in line with the requirements of the Police Service Quality Assurance (PSQA) Scheme or apply their own quality assurance process to ensure the integrity of the Product and any delivery requirements specified in this Licensee. Licensees may be required to evidence their quality assurance processes on receipt of a request for such from the Licensor or an authorised representative.
- 23.5 The Licensor may require Licensees to participate in national PSQA audits. If this Product is selected for auditing, the Licensee shall co-operate with the Licensor in conducting the auditing exercise and undertakes to ensure that its staff comply with its obligations under this clause.

- 23.6 Use or delivery of the Product shall be in accordance with the relevant programme handbook or programme specification. For the avoidance of doubt, this Licence shall take precedence over the handbook and any supplementary guidance documents.
